GHG We still need to have a permanent O.D. for the clinic in Saipan.

GHG Dr. Bob Roberts has agreed to organize the eye booth at the General Conference next year in St. Louis. Many people will be needed to volunteer to help at the booth as greeters and to evaluate screening results.
