Dr. Pedro Gomez also says eye glasses frames are also welcome. So I would ask each active Optometrist to send me or bring to the convention 5 frames or more for Montemorelos. Frames that you have had on the rack that haven't moved would be fine. I can give you a receipt of goods letter and you can deduct fair market price off your income tax You keep records of your donations! Project #2

This past year we have mailed 6 boxes of over 100 pair of the OTC reading glasses to India making a total of 818 pair. Not all boxes vere recieved. Hepzibah Kore, Women's Ministry Director Southern Asia Division of SDA, says thank you for your help providing reading glasses for the Women's Literacy Program. The problem is a duty must be paid before customs will release the glasses. This duty is usually \$40.00 US and comes out of her budget. She now has found a local supplier who will supply her reading glasses for about \$3.50 US each. Both Hepzi and I feel that sending a cash donation to buy glasses in India would save a lot of stress on both sides. So I am suggesting a \$1000.00 gift for glasses to India. 

When the AOA decided to hold their '08 convention in Seattle, the ASDAO voted to hold our convention juxtapostioned to the AOA The AOA convention dates are June 25-29.

The AOA educational program runs Wed., the 25th through Friday, the 27th , these are taking place in downtown Seattle about 40 minutes North of Puyallup. We will start registration for our convention on that Friday afternoon and then have a sundown vesper program beginning about 8:30. Sundown is about 9:10. Ironically, the Washington Conference holds its annual campmeeting during the last two weeks of June at Auburn Adventist Academy. June 28^{th} is the last day. The academy is about 20-25 minutes away from Puyallup. Our local church is only 5 minutes from our motel. From polling our own leader-ship, most would rather meet locally and have our group in charge of the SS and Worship services.....just like the "old days". The majority of our 250 attending Puyallup members will be up at campmeeting. We will need your help leading out for our church service

REGULAR ATTENDEE HATES MISSING CONVENTION THIS YEAR

Roland & Carol Stickel

Both Roland and I feel bad because we cannot be at convention, Jamie is graduating that weekend and we just can't miss that. Next year, Rod should be graduating but it might just be the week before our convention at Puyallup. We had looked forward to going to Branson and of course being with you all. If you don't have all the info you need I could try to write something for it regarding the auction. We had a wonderful mission trip with our academy to the

little island of Bonnaco which is off a little bigger island of Guanaja 12 miles by 4 miles, which is in the Bay Islands off of Hon-duras on the Caribbean side. This little island has about 5000 people on about 15 acres of land. Roland and I as well as 8 others stayed on another island close by that was 3 acres which 2 of the wealthier islanders own and has 2 nice houses on it. Roland and the rest of the eye crew worked for approximately 29 hours and saw 577 patients. They were tiring days. These people do not have eye care other than an Ophthalmologist who comes to see the referrals once in a long while. Ro-land saw people with a lot of strange prescriptions, we tried to fill them as best we could with the Lions donated glasses. A lot of them were ugly and of course they did not want them. The women want to be fashionable and are quite beautiful. We stayed at the same site on the island for 3 days and then went to Guanaja - Savanah Bite for 1 1 /2 days. Had some interesting patients one of the young doctors was a drug addict, our night watchman was legally blind and our host who drove us back and forth from our little island was going in April for his 7th treatment on his 2nd detached retina and Roland said he was legally blind as well, his wife was a good help to him when we went back home about 10 at night without lights. Our host couple were wonderful and I enjoyed visiting with them so much. There was a lot of other activities going on as well - building,

VBS, helping at the school etc. A wonderful experience. The island was crowded but it was peaceful. There was not

much crime even though there are drugs and 60 percent of the people are unemployed. I kind of miss the less stress that we had there even though we were so busy.
