2008 ASDAO 50th CONVENTION PLANS ALL MADE AROUND AOA DATES JUNE 27 - JULY 1 PUYALLUP, WASHINGTON



2008 Convention Host's Dr. Stan & Nancy Pugh

Now that we have entered the New Year, it is time to begin serious consideration to attend the 50th ASDAO Convention here in Puyallup, WA. We voted two years ago to have our '08 Convention to piggyback the AOA Convention in Seattle. We are located about 23 miles South of Seattle or about 35 minutes driving time. Nancy and I have planned for a fun time together at the Best Western Park Plaza

The AOA Education begins on Wednesday, June 25th at the Washington State Convention and

Trade Center which straddles I-5 Freeway in downtown Seattle. The CE information will be available on the AOA web page after February 1st.

Our convention will be quite unlike most previous ASDAO conventions because we will begin on Friday, the 27th, with the registration table opening at noon in the motel lobby area. After a short business meeting, we will drive about one mile to our local SDA church to usher in the Sabbath with a vesper service. Sabbath morning, our own O.D.'s will lead out in the SS and worship services. We will be served lunch in the Fellowship Hall and then head out to Point Defiance Park in North Tacoma to enjoy

nearly 700 acres of hiking trails or sandy beaches, wild



animals (zoo) and aquarium. Some may wish to see Old Fort Nisqually, once an early outpost to the pioneers of the Pacific Northwest. In fact, some may wish to stop by on their way to the

Park to see the Pugh Atlantic Giant Pumpkin Farm! However, only tiny baby pumpkins are visible this time of the year. We will return to the church for dinner and then sundown vespers. The sunsets at 9:10 p.m.

Sunday morning after breakfast, the O.D.'s will head off to Pacific Cataract and Laser Institute in Tacoma for three hours of CE provided by their staff. This beautiful new building also has a state of the art surgery center. For more information go to http://www.pcli.com/.

After lunch, we're off to the world famous Dale Chihuly Museum of Glass where in addition to seeing his handiwork, we can see



where in addition to seeing his handlwork, we can see glass blowers in action as well as other exhibits. There are additional museums nearby or you can watch the ships on Commencement Bay.

The evening meal will be at the church Fellowship Hall where we will enjoy the Auxiliary Banquet and Auction. If everyone can bring something to auction, it is a lot more fun. The funds raised are used to help SDA optometry students scholarships and other mission projects.

Monday morning, we will have another business meeting and then head off to Seattle to visit the Boeing Museum of Flight. This fascinating place takes one from the Wright Brothers to walking on the moon. There is even a small section of the Space Station to walk through. There are many, many different kinds of "flying machines" on display. There you will



also see and tour the Boeing 707 version of Air Force One which served Presidents Kennedy through Ford. You may also wish to walk through the



British Supersonic Concorde airplane. Even though you can spend over five hours there, we have to head off to the Argosy Cruise Company to cruise on Lake Union taking a trip through the famous Ballard Locks which connects the Lake with Puget Sound. It will be a 2 ½ hour trip that you will remember for a lifetime. We can offer additional places for people to enjoy on their own on Tuesday such

as Northwest Trek Wildlife Park(about ½ hr. drive), Mt. Rainier National Park(about 1 hr. drive) or perhaps Wild Waves Water Park in Federal Way (about ½ hr drive).
