

2009 ASDAO Mission Goals

ASDAO members who attended our annual convention discussed many ideas for missions outreach. Here are some of the ideas and goals that were voted and passed.

- This year (2008) or next (2009) ASDAO will sponsor a mission trip with "The Quiet Hour"
- Our organization would provide glasses, O.D.'s, and pharmaceuticals for the sponsored trips.
- We are planning to organize our own mission project within three years that will include several O.D.'s, D.D.S.'s, M.D.'s, R.N.'s, and other medical staff.
 We are planning to conduct a Vacation Bible School and evangelistic series of meetings at the same time.

There are two mission projects in process this year. ASDAO is helping to support the TEEN MISSIONS to the Dominican Republic December 24, 2008 – January 6, 2009. Dr. Roland Stickle will be in charge of the vision clinic. Dr. Alden Curtis is going to Peru in November, 2008. ASDAO is providing the autorefractor and some reading glasses.

I talked with Charlene West of "The Quiet Hour" and she would like us to commit to at least two of the five projects next year. Bill and Jackie Tucker will be going to Cusco, Peru, May 22 – June 6, 2009, and Dominican Republic October 30 – November 14, 2009 and would like as many medical services available as possible. If we have enough support from our members we will help with two or more projects.

If you are planning on going on a mission project next year, let me know ASAP so I can arrange supplies, and equipment. We are planning on two O.D.'s for each trip, preferably one having previous mission trip experience.

Pray about what you can do to help this world- wide missions outreach.

WE NEED HELP FROM EVERY ASDAO MEMBER

We need your help to support our mission trips for 2009 with "The Quiet Hour" going to Peru, and Dominican Republic

The more help we get the more mission trips we can support. ASDAO committed to two projects next year but the "Quiet Hour" is going on six projects. If we get enough support, we can offer the help on more projects. Here is how you can help:

- Volunteer to go on a mission trip. If you have never been on a mission trip, we will try to pair you with an O.D. who has gone on a trip. If you cannot be gone the whole time needed, we will try to accommodate you the best pos-
- We need many O.D.s to collect and sort glasses for our mission projects. Hundreds of pairs of glasses are dispensed for every project. The amount of glasses we receive determine how many mission projects we can support. We need as many glasses as possible as soon as possible.
- If you cannot send glasses, financial donations to buy SV reading glasses will be greatly appreciated. SV readers are about 40 percent of all glasses dispensed. I you would rather buy readers and send them to us, please send more pairs between +1.00 & +1.75 and less of higher powers.
- If you know of someone who would like to help sort glasses, or donate money, please involve them in this project.

If you can help sort glasses, here is what we need:

- Any powers with no more than .50 D of cylinder either lens.
- For high plus and minus up to 1.00 D cyl. Is O.K.
- Any Aphakic glasses acceptable
- Same power OU within .50 D (no anisometropia)
- Bifocals preferred over progressive lenses
- Don't send just frames or lenses
- No RX sunglasses or non RX sunglasses
- No Safety RX's

Suggestion of sources of glasses (not sorted or bagged):

- Local Lions Club
- **District Lions Club Distribution Centers**
- **VOSH Distribution Centers**

If you get glasses from organizations already bagged and labeled, very few pairs will meet the criteria we need. It would be more productive for your time to get "raw" donated glasses (not sorted or neutralized or bagged).

If you can help sort glasses please do the following:

- Insert each pair of glasses in a small zip-lock lab bag, approx. 3" wide by 7" inches long
- Use a 2" wide piece of masking tape on one side near top of bag to record RX
- Record RX as -1.50 -1.75 / +2.00 for a bifocal, (don't record cylinder if less than or equal to .50 D)
- When you get a large box full of glasses, please mail them to:

If you are willing to help with this project please let Dr. Benedict know as soon as possible so plans can be made for the future. We will be needing at least 1000 pair. What ever help you can be will be appreciated.
