Dear ASDAO Friends,

I haven't been able to resist peeking at the San Diego weather reports. Even in the dead of winter, it's been between 68-72 degrees F. - in the 50's at night! June should be delightful!

There is such a huge variety of activities, there will be plenty of enjoyable events for all.

We have reserved a block of rooms at the Hampton Inn about 10 miles north of the airport and convention center for \$ 122 night double, \$ 128 night king plus 12% tourist fees (state and local). There is a complimentary hot breakfast, free internet, and free parking, you can reserve for earlier or latter dates also if you wish for a longer vacation. (Take note, Bob!) You may make your reservations by **Phone 1-858-292-1482** (The last day to receive the group rate is Friday, June 7). [Use the confirmation ASDAO to access this account.] Hotel accommodations in San Diego during the summer are very pricey.

The other thing that will be cost saving for most will be the purchase of a City GO Card, \$ 199 for adults and \$ 176 for children, Purchas your ahead of the convention. This saves up to 55% off gate prices for 49 different attractions (which include almost all the activities we have planning.) (Even Legoland California for those interested.) Once you have this card you may wish to take off for an activity different from everyone else. We are recommending that you purchase a 3 Day card, which will give discounts for the activities we have planned for Friday such as 12 of the attractions at Balboa Park. In addition to several others around town. Additional days are available, either 5 or 7 days. Google San Diego GO card.

Sabbath afternoon at Birch Aquarium at Scripps, and on Monday one of the 8 or 9 tours possible at the African Safari Park. If for some reason you do not use one of the days on your 3-day GO-Cards, you can return it for a refund. However if you do even just one attraction per day, the card is considered used for that day. Some of you may wish to add on a couple of days of vacation and purchase a 5 or 7 day card. MISSION LETTERS TO OUR GC REPRESENTATIVE, LOWELL MEISTER, O.D.

Dear Dr Meister

Here are the objectives of the trip:

1. On sight visit of the eye facilities in the division to see if they are operating according to the standards and philosophy of the church
 2. Assess the different clinics whether they are consistent with Optometry/Ophthalmology practice. Are we keeping up with the current trends?
 3. How we can improve our services in terms of betterment of equipment and personnel. One of the goals of the SID is to make our eye clinics self-reliant. How can we help them achieve self-reliance and sustainability? Perhaps you can come up with suggestions on how you have made your own practice self-reliant.
 4. How do our eye clinics contribute to the over-all mission of the church? What can it do to reach out to the community so the church presence becomes visible making the Lord's love real.
 5. Is there a way you can assist with the sourcing of donors or organizations that could help in the improvement of our clinics
- These are some of my thoughts but perhaps you can come up with other ideas.

Here are the places which we are hoping to visit

1. Lilongwe, Malawi- Has an Optometry clinic which is run by a non-SDA. The Optometrist is paying a rent to the Adventist Health Center in Lilongwe. The clinic has dental and medical services and a small hospital. Would it be possible for this clinic to have its own Optometry clinic. In the past, we had one but due to the poor finances, it closed and then the space was leased.
2. Blantyre, Malawi- Same situation as in Lilongwe. The clinic is leased to a non-SDA but we hope to have our own.
3. Lusaka Eye Hospital in Zambia- We have an Ophthalmologist by the name of Dr Janie Yoo graduated from Loma Linda (her medical degree). It has an Optical shop and also dispense glasses. Owned by the church.
4. Lesotho- Maluti Hospital has a very active eye program with an Ophthalmologist Dr Eustace Penniecook. The eye department/hospital is able to sustain itself. Also has an optical shop.
5. Swazi Eye Services in Manzini Swaziland. This is the only medical work in Swaziland with Dr Joy Padilla as Optometrist. The equipment used are old and out dated. This clinic is not financially stable and sustainable. I had recommended in the past that this clinic be shifted into a dental or medical.

It is my intention to go with you in all of these places but I may have problems with visas for Malawi and Lesotho. For Zambia and Swaziland, they are easy to obtain but the other two countries it takes some time and as a result of my many travels, I may not be able to accompany you all the way. But be assured there will be someone to go with you or meet you.

I am residing here in Johannesburg not in Zimbabwe.

Your arrival on the 9th is all right with me and we can go immediately to Swaziland by car. Please give me your exact time of arrival into Johannesburg and then your departure so I can map out the place we are going to visit.

I can make the bookings from here. I suggest that you just buy the ticket to get to Johannesburg and return and then I will do the rest. I will get the tickets if not travel by road. Lesotho is reachable by road by Zambia and Malawi we need to fly. We then will charge the GC for all your air transport but I need an authorization from you. You can pay for your hotel bills by credit card or else we can pay for you and then pass the charges to the GC.

I look forward to this trip.

This is the tentative plan I have for your coming

April 9 if you arrive in the morning in Johannesburg then we can proceed to Swaziland by car the same day, but if you arrive late, we can leave early morning April 10

April 10 Wednesday-Travel early morning to Swaziland by road. We should get there by 2pm and have a chance to check on the clinic

April 11 Thursday mid morning travel back to Johannesburg

April 12 Friday flight to Malawi

April 13 Sabbath in Malawi

April 14 Sunday in Malawi still

April 15 Monday travel to Lusaka Zambia

April 16 Tuesday visit the Lusaka Eye Hospital. Fly back to Johannesburg 8pm flight

April 17 Wednesday Travel to Lesotho by car and see the Maluti Eye Hospital or by flight. I may not be able to join you in this trip

April 18 Thursday return to Johannesburg and then fly back to the USA in the evening flight. If not you can also fly back to the USA on the 19th of April.

This is the tentative schedule. Once I have your arrival into Joburg and departure date from Joburg, I will have a more definite schedule including flights.

“When you come to Ecuador, will you do a vision clinic?” This was the opening line of an email I received in January of last year. My children’s school does a mission trip every other year and I was preparing to go along. I had been on the previous two trips and had artfully avoided doing much with eyes. I would remove foreign bodies kids acquired on the site, treat an eye infection or two, but that was all. The kids were there to build a church and I wanted to be in the thick of construction. Put down the ophthalmoscope and pick up a trowel for a couple of weeks. That was my plan.

Our mission trip director, Ruth, was conducting a site visit to plan our accommodations, transportation, and activities in Ecuador. When she spoke to the local congregations she would ask, “How can we best serve you while we are here?” The overwhelming reply was, “We would love for you to bring glasses so our people could read the Bible.” Thus, her email to me. UGH.

Why was my instant reaction negative? FEAR. I had never been on a VOSH trip or assisted on one with our group. I didn’t know Spanish. I didn’t have a supply of glasses and medicines. My autorefractor was as big as my youngest child. It was the last minute and I didn’t have time to gather everything I needed. I had lots of excuses. In reality, however, I was afraid of failure. I told our director we would talk about it when she returned, fully planning to have my list of reasons for saying, “No”. But God had other plans.

First I called Dennis Benedict who is in charge of the ASDAO mission clinic kit. The kit was promised to someone else for the dates of my trip. He had some glasses, but not enough. He also reminded me that the Lion’s club has glasses for this purpose, but they needed a couple months to process our orders. All this was secretly good news to me...two excuses for me to tell Ruth.

Unfortunately, that’s when things began to turn around. When she emailed me, Ruth had also emailed Mike who would head up construction for our project. Mike works for the eye bank in our area in conjunction with Lion’s club. He offered to track down their hand-held autorefractor and expedite our getting as many glasses as possible. He also arranged to have them all hand-delivered to us rather than having us pay for shipping. Ruth also let me know that she had a parent ask at the last minute to be added to our group. This woman was an ophthalmic tech who knew some Spanish. Finally, the building project was much smaller than we were used to on our mission trips, so Ruth needed some other activities for the kids to do. All my excuses were gone.

Thus started the adventure of my first vision clinic mission. I trained students to assist. We saw about 100 people each day. I didn’t kill anybody. I found a retinal detachment and sent the person to the city to have it looked at. We were able to give glasses to most of the people who needed them. It was fun.

Now I’m glad I didn’t let fear get in the way. I would have missed out on a great experience and there would be a few more old ladies struggling to read the Bible.

As you look toward the new year, are there fears that are holding you back? Perhaps you have the same attitude I did about mission trips. We have several coming up—India, Peru, Cuba, and the Amazon to name a few. Perhaps you want to expand your business or learn a new skill. Whatever it is I suggest you jump off the cliff
